

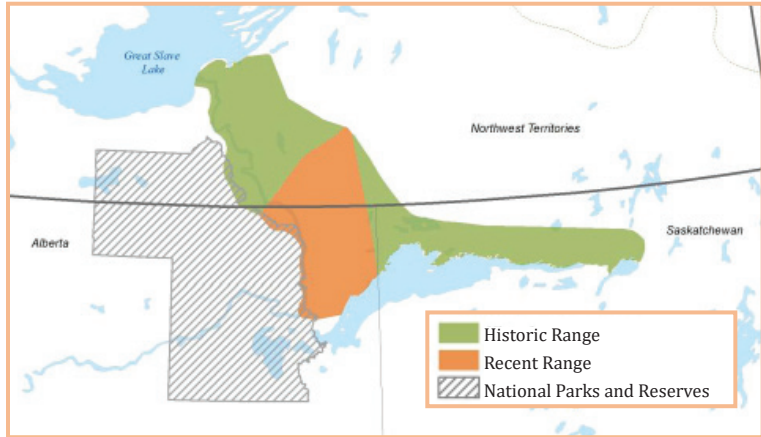


Status: Threatened

Adolescent Markings: Tadpoles are slender and black.

Call: A long drawn out rattling snore which ends with several rapid short grunts.

Eggs: Transparent with black centers, laid in clusters. Females lay one clutch with 600-7000 eggs per year.



Summer Habitat: Meadows and grasslands. Prefer to be in the water.

Hibernation: Non-freezing muddy lake and river beds.

Northern Leopard Frog

(Lithobates pipiens)

Smooth skin with dark spots surrounded by light borders.

Long slender bodies for jumping and swimming.

Usually green, and sometimes slightly brown.

Two light stripes down the back.

Unmarked milky-white underside.
