The purpose of this guide is to help event planners minimize waste and maximize sustainability in the planning and execution of their gatherings. It offers suggestions and steps that will help keep waste out landfills while supporting the local economy and ways of life.

WHAT ARE OUR GOALS?



USE LESS ENERGY

Using less energy results in less greenhouse gas emissions, a large contributor to global warming and climate change.



SUPPORT LOCAL FOODS

Supporting local harvest grows your community and decreases carbon emissions from food transportation.



CREATE LESS WASTE

Protect the land, people, water, plants, and wildlife by creating less waste that can seep into the environment.

WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT?

Planning sustainable events is a significant action against climate change and a great way to support your community. It's important to encourage environmental awareness and set a good example to lead the way for other groups to do the same.



VENUE

Consider the venue where your event is taking place. Some facilities are more energy-efficient than others. Consider hosting your event outdoors when suitable and try to use a facility with efficient light and heat systems for indoor events.

FOOD

Providing local healthy food is good for your community and the environment. Food and drink are often the main sources of waste at an event. Luckily, in the NWT, we can compost or recycle most of our waste.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

It's important to have a great waste management system at your event to not only ensure cleanliness, but to reduce your event's greenhouse gas emissions. Consider how products and services are getting delivered, avoid single use plastics, and reduce paper handouts as much as possible

WASTE - SUSTAINABLE EVENT CHECKLIST

\square Avoid single use plastics and use products with little or no packaging
$\hfill \square$ Separate waste into different bins - Compost, Recycling, and Garbage
\square Put site specific signs in places that have a certain type of waste.

WASTE BINS

Separate waste into different bins. Make it easy for people to put waste in the appropriate bin. Using coloured bins with signs and pictures help.

COMPOST

All food scraps, compostable paper cups, napkins, and plates. Use compostable bags!

RECYCLING

Beverage containers, and other materials depending on your community.



GARBAGE

All other waste including styrofoam, plastics, aluminum plates, and any other waste.

REMINDER

Always check what you can and cannot compost or recycle with your local waste facility.



Avoid plastics with a 'biodegradable' label. In a community compost, it breaks down into smaller pieces of plastic that would have to be removed.

WATER

Every year, we use more than 1.3 million water bottles in the NWT. Nearly 200,000 of those become litter or end up in the landfill. It's important for event planners to make events free of plastic water bottles and offer alternatives to reduce our plastic waste.

#loveNWTwater CAMPAIGN

ABOUT NWT WATER

IT IS SAFE

Tap water has no harmful toxins from plastic packaging. Quality tests are strict and frequent.

IT IS LOCAL

Community governments invest in water treatment so that everyone can have safe drinking water.

IT IS CHEAP

Tap water costs less than \$0.01 per litre. Not only is it sustainable, but it is also economical.

WATER - SUSTAINABLE EVENT CHECKLIST

☐ Have tap water easily accessible.
Offer alternatives like refillable water jugs.
☐ Provide reusable cups and encourage people to bring reusable water bottles.

OTHER THINGS TO THINK ABOUT:

- Use environmentally friendly cleaning products, or choose a cleaning service that uses them.
- Ocompensate an Elder to hold a water ceremony and educate more people on traditional sustainable practices on the water and on the land.
- ♦ Promote the protection of water from pollution and waste.
